## Teach Learn Grow at All Saints' College

### Overview

All Saints' College is committed to incorporating into our educational programs a range of environments and experiences to enhance our students' learning. As such, Service Learning is undertaken as an integral part of our offering, and these activities reflect the mission and values of All Saints' College.

The *Teach, Learn, Grow* experience seeks to take volunteers to disadvantaged rural primary schools in WA to mentor and tutor students one-on-one in knowledge gaps. All Saints' College remains the only school to run the *Teach, Learn, Grow* model, which otherwise has only been run through universities, for university students. However, in conjunction with *Teach, Learn, Grow*, All Saints' College is pleased to offer this opportunity to a group of the College's Year 11 and 12 students.

The program focuses on the development of the academic abilities of the students at Bayulu and Muladja Remote Community Schools whom our All Saints' Year 11 and 12 volunteers work alongside. This will include one-to-one tutoring, which the volunteers are trained to provide, as well as activities to encourage increased school attendance. The volunteers from All Saints' College receive training and support from College staff and our partners at *Teach, Learn, Grow*. The service within the school is complemented with a program to build a respectful appreciation of the culture of the indigenous people of the area. As such, a number of the activities are set beyond the classroom and are aimed at developing a strong understanding of the long history and connection to the land of those whom we are working alongside.

The Year 11 and 12 students who take part in this trip have access to the following experiences:


### **ACTIVITIES:**

- Training in tutoring of primary students
- Visit to the Sister of St. John's Relationship Exhibition (Broome)
- Broome town exploration
- Cable Beach visit and swim
- On country tour of the Mimbi Caves
- Breakfast with families in a remote indigenous community
- Tutoring primary school students (5 days)
- Cave school visit on GoGo Station
- Visit to Historical Museum – Broome
- Department of Parks and Wildlife Geikie Gorge Boat Tour

### Timing

This program is run in the last week of June, which is the first week of the mid-year holiday break for All Saints' College students, and the final week of term from students and Bayulu and Muladja Remote Community Schools.

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## Engagement with All Saints' College Four Pillars of Service Learning

**Intentional Learning:** The volunteers from All Saints' College receive training and support from College staff and our partners at *Teach, Learn, Grow*. Through the broader program in which students and staff visit significant local sites and communities, a growth in understanding and of respectful appreciation for the culture of the indigenous people of the area is formed. The program is also aimed at developing a strong understanding of the long history and connection to the land of the indigenous custodians of the land on which we work.

**Meaningful Service:** The program focuses on the development of the academic abilities of the students at Bayulu and Muladja Remote Community Schools whom our All Saints' Year 11 and 12 volunteers work alongside. This will include one-to-one tutoring, which the volunteers are trained to provide, as well as activities to encourage increased school attendance.

**Diversity:** The service within the school is complemented with a program to build a respectful appreciation of the culture of the indigenous people of the area.

**Partnership:** This trip is a part of ongoing partnerships with Bayulu Remote Community School, Muladja Remote Community School and *Teach, Learn, Grow*.
