Year 4 Sambhota Tibetan School, Paonta Sahib Voiceworks Program

"Reaching Out - Connecting with Communities beyond my Own"

Overview

This program is designed to begin a connection between students from All Saints' College and Sambhota Tibetan Colony School, Paonta Sahib. The aim is to create a connection that develops the written and spoken English language skills of the students at STS, Paonta Sahib through interaction with All Saints' College students in Year 4.

In the first part of this program All Saints' students will record a collection of Tibetan folk tales and poems with which the students at STS, Paonta Sahib are already familiar. These recordings will be sent across to STS, Paonta Sahib in digital form (on USB Flash Drives provided by the Head of Service Learning) for the Year 5 Tibetan students to read along to as they hear the stories that they already know read in a variety of accents. This will provide an initial connection between students at the two schools and form a backdrop to the next part of this program.

The second part of the program is based on direct connection between students of each school through both letter writing and Skype connection. Once the stories have been recorded, sent and received the students at All Saints' College, in small groups, will write letters to the students of STS, Paonta Sahib to begin a letter exchange. This will be followed with periodic Skype connections between the students in Year 4 at All Saints' College and the Year 5 students at STS, Paonta Sahib. The frequency and timing of these contacts will be negotiated by staff at both schools.

Timing

The recording and sending of English language versions of a collection of Tibetan folk tales and poems from All Saints' College to STS, Paonta Sahib will occur across first Semester each year to be ready for students as they begin Year 5 at STS, Paonta Sahib in June. Students at each school will begin to write letters to each other at the beginning of Semester 2, at which time the staff at both schools will work towards setting up times for ongoing Skype connection between the students.

In this program opportunities can be created to foster positive relationships and cultural understanding between students from disparate countries and cultures

Partnership: Sambhota Tibetan School, Paonta is a partner of All Saints College, sharing links with the College in years 5, 8&9 and through a future immersion program for Years 10 to 12, as well as through our staff exchange program which is a part of the Restless Curiosity program for staff at All Saints' College.

Recorded Tibetan folk tales and poems are to be saved on USB Flash Drives provided by the head of Service Learning. Each USB Flash Drive will hold an individual Tibetan folk tale or poem that was been recorded a number of times, each by different students. The names of each file will be set out in the format:

(Name of folk tale or Poem)-(Name of Student Reader).wav

E.g. - Old Woman and Wolf-Tim Russell.wav

The idea of this form of recording is to help order the collection of read Tibetan folk tales and poems and to provide the opportunity for students to hear the same folk tale or poem read by different voices with differing pronunciations and accents. The benefit of this for the students at STS, Paonta Sahib is the growth of a deeper and broader ability to understand English spoken by a range of people.
