Unique paths for each student

All Saints' College has been working towards what it describes as a "personalisable" model of education which focuses on the diversity of its students' interests, abilities, passions and skills.

The implementation of this unique learning structure at the college coincides with the recently published Gonski education report which recommends personalised learning and teaching based on each student's needs, in order to maximise outcomes and growth.

At All Saints' College, this personalised model, and many other future-focused learning initiatives, are guided and implemented by Djoowak: The Beyond Boundaries Institute (BBI), a study centre within the school.

Djoowak is an Aboriginal word meaning following generation.

"Fundamental to the BBI's mission is the college's belief in the importance of student-

centred learning, and the even greater imperative of student-directed learning – hence the notion of a personalised education," said All Saints' College principal, Belinda Provis.

"The 'personalisable' education model at All Saints' will continue to value academic rigour.

"It also focuses on the development of skills, while fostering in our students a sense of excitement about change, seeing it and uncertainty as presenting opportunity, rather than as something to fear."

Recognising there is no one pathway to a tertiary education or to a range of futures, the BBI aims to prepare students not just for exams, but for a fulfilling and meaningful life.

All Saints' College's approach ensures that young people are interacting, learning in, and contributing to local, national and global contexts.

residency and praised the work of the college and the BBI.
